Thoughts from Rev'd Jenni Duffy

The Oxford dictionary defines potential as: *'latent qualities or abilities that may be developed and lead*

to future success or usefulness'.

We all have things that we know we are good at, sometimes it is a natural ability, or an interest or hobby that needs to be developed and encouraged. Sometimes, though, we have gifts and skills that we are unaware of, perhaps they have been hindered by lack of confidence, or time to develop and nurture them; sometimes these gifts are recognised by others long before we ever become aware of them.

As people of God, we are called to encourage one other, to build each other up so that the whole body of Christ may grow and fulfil its potential. (1 Thess 5:11)

Jesus said: *"I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full."*

(John 10:10).

When was the last time someone noticed something you had done, and thanked you for it? or inspired you to try something new, or to develop an existing ability?

ROLL UP EVERYONE! BAINES' BAKE-OFF CHALLENGE:

Bake a Swiss Roll for our Baines Bake-Off challenge! Interested? Here's what to do:

- Follow the recipe below (used by Baines for over 70 years);
- Deliver to the church on **Saturday 3rd July** – judging takes place on the morning of Sunday 4th July;
- Enclose your name, address, contact details + £4 entry (for church funds) in a sealed envelope and place it underneath your entry;
- PRIZE for the winning entry – a BAINES HAMPER!!!
- Collect your Swiss Roll on Sunday afternoon – eat and enjoy, or freeze for later;
- Good luck!

PREPARE:

Heat oven 220c/200 fan/gas 6 & use the middle shelf.

Grease edges of an approx. 13" x 8"/33cm x 21cm baking tray and line with greaseproof paper. Prepare another sheet of paper sprinkled with sugar to tip the roll onto as soon as it comes out of the oven.

MAKE:

WHISK UNTIL CREAMY: 3.5oz/100g castor sugar & 2 eggs at room temperature. SIFT AND FOLD IN GENTLY: 2.75oz/76g plain flour
Spread evenly on your baking tray.

BAKE:

Approx. 7 minutes middle shelf. Lift out of the tray by holding the base paper and gently tip onto the prepared sugared paper.

Wet the cake paper lining, then gently peel off.

Cool for a few minutes and spread your jam. If your jam is cold warm it slightly to make it easier to spread

ROLL:

Placing your cake with the short end at the back of your work surface, gently and tightly roll the cake towards you, using the paper to help it stay even.

Place on a pretty plate with the fold underneath, and, resisting the temptation to eat it immediately, present it for judging by Richard Baines, Master Baker!

Young Christians to march from Cornwall to Glasgow to campaign for Climate Justice

Marching from Cornwall to Glasgow, the pilgrims will call on world leaders to address the Climate Emergency.

The relay will move from Truro Cathedral, near to where the G7 met, to Glasgow where COP26 will be begin on October 31. World leaders will be meeting in both places and young Christians are hoping nations will take tangible steps to reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

The relay is expected to see a number of young people opting to do small walks or cycle rides between the stopping points.

Rachel Mander, a young Christian and the relay co-leader, said: “We stand in solidarity with people and places that are being plunged into debt and poverty because of climate change.

More carbon emissions mean more disease, more food insecurity and more poverty.

We will not let the UK government host summits on our doorstep only to hear more talk and no action.”

Volunteers are encouraged to sign-up to support walkers, cyclists, and other pilgrims as the relay passes their diocese.
